#### 8. Announcements - PICTURES Mr Perez Reviewed Announcements

- a. Monroe is continuing to pass out PAWS tickets to students who are caught following our school-wide PAWS expectations. Every teacher/class collects the tickets all week, and every Friday, there are drawings for prizes in the classrooms. Then, the teachers turn in the tickets to the cafeteria, where the administrators have a second drawing, so that more students have an opportunity to win!
- b. The PBIS team has begun planning to establish a "Monroe Student Store" where students who earn a PAWS ticket and Bear Buck at the same time! They will be cut in half and we will continue to use the PAWS ticket for item a and the Bear Buck to purchase items at the student store.
- c. Monroe is continuing teaching and encouraging the Character Traits of the Month. At the end of the month, each teacher and elective teacher chooses one student who exhibited that particular character trait. The incentive is that the students receive a certificate, names are announced over the loudspeaker, they have lunch with the school counselor, and they are provided a donut to go along with their lunch!

There are fun, engaging, and educational activities planned for the students. In addition, there is a school-wide drawing/coloring contest where the students will create a poster/drawing of something that represents Hispanic Heritage Month.

It was a wonderful opportunity for parents and students to be together enjoying one another's company during the school day out by the Monroe Museum.
