 - a. Data Quality Index Report: Aug. C, Sept. A, Oct. A, Nov. A, Dec. B
 - b. Parent Square Participation James Monroe is at 100% Need approximately 0 family records to reach 100%
 - c. There are 9 students, in Grades 1 & 2, that have a 4 on last year's ELPAC
 - 4 students met the criteria on the Fall Reading Fluency Assessment
 - 4 students met the criteria on the Winter Reading Fluency Assessment
 - 1 student did not meet the criteria on the Winter Reading Fluency Assessment

8. Announcements -Mr. Perez discussed and reviewed all announcements

- a. Monroe is continuing to pass out PAWS tickets to students who are caught following our school-wide PAWS expectations. Every teacher/class collects the tickets all week, and every Friday, there are drawings for prizes in the classrooms. Then, the teachers turn in the tickets to the cafeteria, where the administrators have a second drawing, so that more students have an opportunity to win!
- b. The PBIS team has begun planning to establish a "Monroe Student Store" where students who earn a PAWS ticket and Bear Buck at the same time! They will be cut in half and we will continue to use the PAWS ticket for item a and the Bear Buck to purchase items at the student store.
- c. Monroe is continuing teaching and encouraging the Character Traits of the Month. At the end of the month, each teacher and elective teacher chooses one student who exhibited that particular character trait. The incentive is that the students receive a certificate, names are announced over the loudspeaker, they have lunch with the school counselor, and they are provided a donut to go along with their lunch!
- d. Monroe supported the community by having its annual Monroe Give-Away, where used items are collected and sorted then given to the community for free. This occurred on Saturday, Nov. 18th from 9:00 11:00 am
- e. On the evening of November 29th, James Monroe held a Polar Expressed themed Literacy Night. Mrs. Larrivee put together a team to present fun and effective reading strategies that could be implemented at home. At the end, students and parents received a Polar Express Bell, free books and free hot chocolate and bread!
- f. Monroe supported the community with a Food Drive that began in early December and ran all the way to December 19th. The school's student advocate and her team will organize and distribute the food to our families. There are prizes and incentives for those classrooms who collected the most items.
- g. On December 1st, 2023, Monroe had its first ever "Jingle Run" where the students collected donation and ran, jogged, and/or walked around the track for approximately 20 minutes. When they were finished, they were treated with a hot chocolate and candy cane. The Demond Middle School Band was present to provide music to the students. Everyone had a wonderful time, and are planning to repeat this event in the Spring! All proceeds and monies raised will go directly back to the students!
- h. Through the first weeks of December, all grade levels participated in the Monroe Holiday Program. Parents and friends were invited to enjoy their students perform and sing various Holiday Songs. The students sounded great, and the staff and community enjoyed their performances!
- i. The Annual Lighting of the James Monroe Museum will be on Thursday, December 21st from 5:30 6:15 pm. There will be free hot chocolate and cookies for the community. The Parent Club will also be selling goodies.
- j. Good News Club is on the Monroe campus every Tuesday @ 2:45 to support students with positive messages through songs, stories, and games.
