- 5. Approval of Previous Minutes December 1, 2023 (motion needed) Mrs. Martinez motioned to approve the minutes from December 1, 2023. Mrs. Clarice Guzman seconded the motion. 7 ayes, 0 nays, 2 absent; motion carried.
- 6. New Business
  - a. School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA)
    - i. Local Assessment Data Ms. Munoz reviewed NWEA data from Winter (December 2023) administration. Students in grades 3-6 take the Reading assessment and grades 1-6 take the Math assessment.

In reading, grades 3-4 saw an increase in met/exceeded category from Fall 2023 to Winter 2023. Schoolwide we saw an increase from 26.2% met/exceeded in the Fall to 27.3% in the Winter.

In math, grades 3-6 saw an increase in met/exceeded category from Fall 2023 to Winter 2023. Schoolwide we saw an increase from 21.3% in the Fall to 27% in the Winter. EL's

**School Profile Report–Fall to Winter** 

- 61st percentile of growth is the target that is wanted for students
- In reading, 27% of students in grades 3-6 are making growth. The remaining are not making adequate growth.
- If a student is already behind they have to grow more as the target keeps moving.
- In math, 42% of students in grades 1-6 are closing the gap.
- NWEA is a good predictor of how our students will do on the CAASPP assessment.

## ii. Panorama Survey

Survey is administered three times a year. Provides an opportunity for student voice to express their perspective about the school environment.

Comparison results from Winter 2022 to Winter 2023

- School Belonging How students feel as a valued member of the school community. Grades 3-5 had an increase of 5%. Grade 6 had a decrease of 6%.
- School Climate Perceptions of overall social and learning climate of school. Grades 3-5 had an increase of 6%. Grade 6 had an increase of 8%.
- School Engagement- How attentive and invested students are in school. Grades 3-5 and grade 6 had an increase of 1%.
- School Safety Perceptions of student physical and psychological safety at school. Grades 3-5 had an increase of 10%. Grade 6 had an increase of 6%

Data shows as the grade levels go higher, fewer students answered favorably. Data was shared with staff by the PBIS team. School Engagement is an area we want to focus on. PBIS team determined teachers would send weekly updates via Parent Square sharing what students are learning and questions they might ask their child to get families talking more about school. Students will take the survey one more time in the Spring. Mrs. Guzman asked how the students answer the question and take the test. Mrs. Pistoresi explained that the teacher helps read the question and explain what the answers will mean. There will be a parent survey at the end of the year.
